The Elkridge Heritage Society's headquarters is located at the Brumbaugh House (circa 1870) at 5825 Main Street in Elkridge. The Brumbaugh House is the former home and office of Dr. Bruce Brumbaugh, a beloved doctor who practiced in Elkridge for over 60 years. The Elkridge Heritage Society maintains a medical vignette of Dr. Brumbaugh's office as it used to be. As the owner of the Brumbaugh House itself, The Elkridge Heritage Society is responsible for all maintenance of the house and grounds. Furthermore, as the caretaker of the historical archives of Elkridge, the Society preserves the varied experiences that reflect our heritage; and in so doing, records the diversity and change that this region has experienced. Step inside the house and be transported to days gone by, where there are many books, articles and memorabilia representing the industry of Elkridge, the

churches, shops, taverns, sports teams, and the private homes of prominent citizens.

The Society holds regular presentations about the area's history on such diverse topics as the role of Elkridge and nearby railroads in the Civil War, Elkridge sports, the Patapsco Heritage Greenway, Belmont, a pictorial guide to Lower Elkridge, the history of the area churches, and memories about of the Davis & Hemphill Factory which is now the office space for Hamel Builders, Inc. Our general meetings are held the 2nd Tuesday of March, May, July, September, and November, with a special holiday activity at the end of December.

Wish List for the Brumbaugh House

In September 2012, thanks to a generous gift from Ed Hamel, we had the outside of our headquarters at 5825 Main Street renovated. The painters chose a lighter green paint in keeping with the style of Victorian age during which the house was built. Our curator requested a rust red door, which became one of the accent colors. During the renovations, it became clear where additions were made to the house by stripping off the old cedar shakes in the back. There we exposed the original clapboard. Unfortunately the

clapboard did not extend all the way around the house, so we kept the cedar shakes on the rest.

There is still much to be done, and we cannot proceed without your help. Here is our current wish list for the house, with estimated costs where possible. For some of the items, we hope to get donations in kind, or volunteer labor.
